6. PRESENTATIONS AND DELEGATIONS

a. Hampton RCMP

Cst. Steve Shannon provided Council with an overview of December 2011 RCMP report. He noted that 741 vehicles were checked during the Routine Vehicle Checkstop Program resulting in thirty-nine written warnings and six charges under the Provincial Offences and Procedures Act and one 7-day suspension (Alcohol related).

Cst. Shannon stated that the RCMP members took part in the Annual Santa Claus Parade promoting the RCMP Community Angels Program which collected approximately \$2,000 in cash and goods donations for the Hampton Food Bank.

He also reported that four youth and one adult were arrested under the Controlled Drug and Substances Act at Hampton High School. A further eleven students were identified as participating either directly or indirectly in illegal drug activity. No charges were laid in these instances; however alternate dispute resolution with students and parents was utilized with follow-up to continue.

Council thanked him for the report.
