1. CLOSED SESSION

6.1 Hampton RCMP

Cst. Manon MacKenzie reviewed the RCMP report for March 2013. She noted that the majority of the property crimes were thefts from vehicles. She encouraged residents to lock their vehicles as these were crimes of opportunity. She reported that there were several school walk-throughs. They complete a minimum of one patrol per month per school. Cst. MacKenzie reported there were seven vehicle check stops performed. The RCMP hope to have bicycle patrols again this year.

6.2 Zoning By-law Amendment

Carolyn Walker, Building and Development Officer presented the proposed amendment to the Zoning By-law to allow for grocery stores in Commercial One "C1" and Commercial Three "C3" Zones.

Council directed the Town Clerk to proceed with the By-law readings of the Zoning By-law amendments.
