6. PRESENTATIONS AND DELEGATIONS

6.1 <u>Hampton RCMP</u>

Sgt. O'Connell presented the RCMP report. He noted that there were 167 calls for service or self-generated files for this period. The Vehicle Check Stop Program saw 1105 vehicles checked with 15 warnings, 6 charges and 2 roadside alert tests resulting in one suspension. He noted that several verbal warnings were given. Foot patrols were conducted at local bars, businesses and parks in the month of July.

There were vehicle break-ins reported. Residents are reminded to lock their vehicles.

He noted that there were would be high visibility as students head back to school in September.

6.2 Heart and Stroke's Big Bike – Hampton Community Bike

Dave Carr, Gillian Gresh and Charlotte Steeves presented information on the Heart and Stroke Foundation's Big Bike, and in particular Hampton's Community Bike ride taking place on September 19th at 9:30 a.m. They are looking for representatives from the Town of Hampton to take part. They ask that each participant raise a minimum of \$50 per participant for the Heart and Stroke Foundation. Gillian Gresh provided Council with information on how some of the fundraising dollars are spent, including Tele-Stroke and an awareness campaign on sweetened beverages. She noted that Automated External Defibrillators were installed at Hampton High School and Holly's Restaurant.

11 REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES

11.1 Planning Advisory Committee

Councillor Behr was concerned about cash in lieu of land for public purpose. Troy Mombraquette, the developer, indicated that the development would include public green space for the residents of the apartments to use. Councillor Behr inquired about the possibility of underground parking. The developer did not feel this would be a cost effective option and would result in too high of rents. Mayor Chorley inquired about a future street to the Thomas property. The Developer and his surveyor, Steve Saunders, indicated that the future street had been removed. It was noted that the Thomas property had access from William Bell Drive.

Moved Deputy Mayor Crossman and seconded by Councillor Bond that the Town of Hampton approve the tentative subdivision plan, labeled Dwg. No T-053 – Park Place Homes Ltd., dated June 20, 2013, prepared by Keirstead Quigley & Roberts including:

- The variance for the minimum lot width to 90 metres for Block A as granted by the Planning Advisory Committee;
- The variance for the minimum lot width to 66 metres for Block B as granted by the Planning Advisory Committee;

Final approval of this subdivision is conditional on:

- The developer paying the appropriate subdivision filing fee;
- The developer entering into a development agreement with the Town of Hampton;
- Submission of final subdivision plans and engineered drawings signed by all appropriate authorities;
- Placement of appropriate bonding as determined by the Town's engineer;
- Cash in lieu of Land for Public Purpose
- The developer meeting the Town of Hampton Water Supply Assessment Guidelines, including the conditions of the New Brunswick Department of Environment in their letter dated July 10, 2013
- Completion of an acceptable Storm Water Management Plan, approved by the Town, with no change to the existing runoff coefficient; and
- The completion of sidewalk, curb and gutter on Elmwood to William Bell Drive with all new infrastructure consistent with the adjacent subdivision. as recommended by the Planning Advisory, Public Works Advisory and Utilities Commission, Environment and Leisure Services Advisory Committees.

The Town CAO reviewed the Economic Development and Tourism committee minutes. Deputy Mayor Chorley noted that there is a new community bulletin board located in the Town Square.
