1. CLOSED SESSION

2. OPEN REGULAR SESSION

Mayor Chorley called the Open Session to order at 7:03 p.m. It was noted that Deputy Mayor Crossman had a previous engagement and would not be in attendance.

6. DELEGATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

6.1 Cpl. Pat Cole and Sgt. MacKinnon – Hampton RCMP Incident Report

Council welcomed Sgt. Mark MacKinnon to Hampton. Council expressed their concerns that there were still concerns about activities in and around the Town Square Pavilion. Council thanked Cpl. Pat Cole for the exemplary work he had done as Acting Sergeant and wished him well on his upcoming retirement.

6.2 Holly Lightfoot, Bird Studies Canada – Chimney Swifts

Holly Lightfoot of Bird Studies Canada provide information on Chimney Swifts, a small greybrown bird with a pale throat and a wing span of 30 cm. They are commonly mistaken for bats at dusk. She said that they cling to vertical surfaces, in particular, the inside of chimneys and old trees. She informed Council that the Hampton Courthouse is home to Chimney Swifts during the migration season and more importantly during the breeding season. She said that it is likely that they are using this chimney for nesting, which means that only one pair of Chimney Swifts would be using the chimney. She said this is quite different, for example, from the roosting chimney, like the one at Lutz Longstaff Parish building that could see hundreds of swifts roosting in it during the migration season. Chimney Swifts are migratory birds and are in the Hampton area during spring and summer. She stated that Chimney Swift populations have declined by 95% over the past 40 years, and they are currently listed as "Threatened" on both the provincial and national Species at Risk registries. The decline in population is due to changes in climate and weather, human interactions with the Chimney Swifts, declines in insect prey and loss of habitat.

She noted that many members of the Saint John Naturalists club monitor and view the birds in our community. Don MacPhail, of the Saint John Naturalist Club spoke briefly about his organization. Ms. Lightfoot also noted that birders make great tourists.

She is asking Council to be a good Chimney Swift host by either leaving the chimney at the Courthouse uncapped or installing the cap after the fall migration and removing before the Chimney Swifts return in the spring. She also hoped that the Town could act as stewards for the Chimney Swifts and their habitat and raise awareness about them in the community. She felt this fit well with the Town's motto "*It's Our Nature*."

Council thanked her for her presentation.

6.3 Bailey Brogan – Partners for Climate Protection Presentation

Bailey Brogan presented a report on the Partners for Climate Protection: Milestone 3, *Developing a Local Action Plan*. The process included meeting with Committees of Council. These committees provided suggestions for decreasing Greenhouse Gas emissions in Hampton. The most popular suggestions were tree planting and increasing active transportation (walking, biking, etc.) by improving roadways and trails.

Ms. Brogan reviewed the goals of the Local Action Plan. This included things like retrofitting buildings, creating policies regarding idling, promoting compost and recycling programs, tree plantings and increased awareness of public transportation.

She stated that the next steps would be to update corporate greenhouse gas inventory, use corporate progress to motivate the community and implement the plan. The plan will help the Town achieve emission reduction goals and become a leader of environmental stewardship.

Council thanked her for her presentation.

Moved by Councillor Doucet and seconded by Councillor Bond that the Town of Hampton submit the Partners for Climate Protection: Milestone 3 Local Action Plan to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions in the Town of Hampton as presented.
