6.1 Cherry Brook Zoo

Cathy White stated that she was a member of the Board of Directors of the Cherry Brook Zoo. She said this was the 41st year for the zoo. It is a registered non-profit charitable organization.

Lynda Collrin, Volunteer Director Zoo Development/Primatologist provided Council will an overview of some of the zoos programs and new animal acquisitions, including Karma, their new tiger. They will be participating in the Hampton Santa Claus parade this year.

Len Collrin, stated he has been at the zoo since the beginning. He said that they were the first accredited zoo in Atlantic Canada. He said the Cherry Brook Zoo is still very relevant but they no longer try to compete with Moncton's Magnetic Hill Zoo. They increasingly focus on the educational component. He indicated that many students from Hampton have worked at the zoo. Students working at the zoo are credited with prerequisites for university courses. He stated that he and his wife live at the zoo year-round. It is a twenty-four hour, seven day a week passion and career.

Ms. Collrin stated that they are asking for Council to support the zoo with a monetary donation in 2015. In addition, they would appreciate support in promoting the zoo and encourage Hampton residents to visit them.

Council stated that they will consider the request during budget deliberations.
