6. DELEGATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

6.1 RCMP Report

Sgt. McKinnon reviewed the RCMP Incident Report for July 2015. He followed up with the concerns regarding recent reports of vandalism and doorbell ringing in Hampton. He stated that many of the calls are mischief. They are conducting foot patrols, as well as patrols in the unmarked cars.

6.2 Public Hearing – Zoning By-law Amendment

Mayor Chorley called the Public Hearing for the new *By-law #203-12 A Bylaw to Amend Zoning By-law 190-10* to order.

Overview of the Proposed Changes

The Building and Development Officer provided an overview of the proposed amendments. She noted that in recent years, the Planning Advisory Committee has reviewed several requests to allow for chickens in residential zones.

She noted that the proposed Zoning By-law amendment would include amendments to Sections: 2.0 Definitions, 4.0 General Provisions for all Zones, 6.0 Residential "R" Zone, 8.0 Town Centre "TC" Zone and 9.0 Mixed Use "MU" Zone.

It would include the addition of definitions for Chickens and for Livestock. Provisions for the keeping of chickens would be added to the General Provisions section. Finally it would include the addition of the keeping of chickens as a permitted use in a Residential, Town Centre and Mixed Use zones.

Official Written Comments of the PAC

The Clerk stated that the Building and Development Officer reviewed the proposed amendment with the Planning Advisory Committee. Their written minutes state that they request that in lieu of having specified lot dimensions (Length & Width) within the by-law that there just be an overall lot area presented in order to accommodate non-standard lot dimensions. The Building and Development Officer made this change to the proposed By-law Amendment. PAC recommended that Council approve the Zoning By-law amendment.

Written Public Comments

The Clerk noted that no written public comments were received.

Public Comments from the floor

Rosa Vautour, 163 William Bell Drive: Ms. Vautour stated that she has been granted a temporary variance from PAC to allow for the keeping of chickens on her property. She is very proud of her hens. She has had a very positive experience and it has brought her a lot of joy. She feeds her hens her table scraps thus reducing her garbage. She encourages Council to pass the Zoning By-law amendment.

The Mayor will call three times for any others who wish to address Council on the By-law. The Mayor concluded the Public Hearing.
