11.2 Public Works Advisory and Utilities Commission

Moved by Councillor Bond and seconded by Deputy Mayor Doucet that the Town of Hampton submit the following Five Year Provincial Designated Highway Plan for 2018-2022:

- 2018 Route 121 Main Street milling and paving (base and seal) from end of 2016 contract towards Kennebecasis River Road. Approximate length 0.725km.
- 2019 Route 121 Main Street milling and paving (base and seal) from end of 2018 contract to Kennebecasis River Bridge. Approximate length 0.725km.
- 2020 Mill and Pave (seal) Hall Road from Main Street to the Town Limit (Route 100).
- 2021 Route 100 Main Street milling and paving (pad and seal) from the Hall Road to Lakeside Road. Approximate length 2.0km
- 2022 Route 121 Main Street milling and paving (pad and seal) from Kennebecasis River Bridge to the town limit. Approximate length 2.9km.

- A backflow valve shall be installed between the basement drain and the sanitary sewer main. Backflow valve to be installed on sewer lateral if one isn't already in place.
- The owner of 11 Riverdale Drive is responsible for all the expenses associated with this work.
- The owner of 11 Riverdale Drive shall sign a release absolving the Town of any liability. This document shall be notarized and registered with SNB,
