2. OPEN REGULAR SESSION

6. DELEGATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

a. <u>Hampton RCMP</u>

Sgt. Rodier reviewed the October 2017 incident report with Council. She noted that there was a focus on check stops coming on and off the Kingston Peninsula do to a rash of break-ins in that area.

She provided an update on an ongoing noise complaint on the Pickwauket Road. Staff will provide her with additional information for the file.

b. Saint John Hospital Foundation

Darren McLeod, Senior Philanthropy Specialist with the Saint John Hospital Foundation provided Council with an overview of The Give Campaign. This campaign will focus on the renovation and retrofit of Ambulatory Care Clinic 1. Mr. McLeod stated that Ambulatory Care Clinic 1 is the busiest outpatient clinic at the Saint John Regional Hospital, serving over 40,000 patients a year.

He noted that the Saint John Regional Hospital and Ambulatory Care Clinic 1 provide a full spectrum health care services to the residents of the Town of Hampton. He noted that there are 33 speciality service clinics used by citizens year-round. He also noted that many of the hospital's physicians, clinicians, specialists, and staff are residents of Hampton.

The Saint John Hospital Foundation is asking the Town of Hampton for a \$5,000.00 gift to support the enhancement and expansion of Ambulatory Care Clinic 1 at the Saint John Regional Hospital.

Moved by Councillor Bond and seconded by Councillor Beach that the Saint John Hospital Foundation's request be referred to the Health Care Committee for recommendation to the Finance Committee for consideration in the 2018 budget.

c. <u>Saint John Theatre Company</u>

Stephen Tobias, Executive Director of the Saint John Theatre Company Inc. (SJTC) stated that he was reaching out to the Town of Hampton to sponsor their Education Outreach initiatives in the amount of \$1,000 for the 2017-2018 theatre season.

He indicated that in the 2016-2017 season, the SJTC produced and presented over 180 performances of 41 creative works in 10 venues on 2 continents. They have developed two main programs that anchor their Education Outreach initiatives:

<u>Classics for the Classroom</u>: Every year the SJTC produces a Main-stage work that supports high-school curriculum and involves partnerships with the schools. The program is supported by educators who encourage students to read the novel or the play. To compliment this program, the SJTC offers study materials, pre-show events, special student performances at Imperial theatre and post-Show talkback sessions with the artists. This season they will be performing Shakespeare in Love, supported by the reading of Romeo and Juliet in the classrooms.

The SJTC Theatre on the Road program: This is a new theatre touring model which is based on a few simple principals: The SJTC partners with an outside producer who has created high-end curriculum-supporting work, the SJTC coordinates a tour with the cooperation of the district school board, and the SJTC acquires the necessary funding so that there will be no charge to either the schools of individual students for the event.

Moved by Councillor Beach and seconded by Councillor Behr that the Saint John Theatre Company's request be referred to the Finance Committee for consideration in the 2018 budget.
