### 14 New Business

#### 14.1 Bank of Nova Scotia Line of Credit

WHEREAS it is necessary for the Municipality to obtain an operating line of credit (based on current year General and Utility Operating Fund Budgets) through our financial institution, Bank of Nova Scotia, Saint John, NB

WHEREAS the amount to be borrowed cannot exceed 4% of the 2010 General Operating Fund (\$5,219,207) and 50% of the 2010 Utility Operating Fund (\$278,823) Budgets THEREFORE:

MOVED BY Deputy Mayor Bond and seconded by Councillor Doucet that the Town of Hampton obtain an operating line of credit through the Bank of Nova Scotia, Saint John, New Brunswick, in the amount of \$208,800 and \$11,200 respectively for the year 2010. The signing officers will be the Mayor or Deputy Mayor, Clerk or Treasurer or Assistant Clerk/Treasurer.

#### 14.2 Traffic Circle

Moved by Councillor Behr and seconded by Deputy Mayor Bond that the Town of Hampton enter into a Purchase and Sale agreement with Cobalt Properties Limited for portions of PID 30262521 required for the Main Street traffic circle.

#### 14.3 Municipal Plan

Moved by Councillor Behr and seconded by Deputy Mayor Bond that the Town of Hampton approve additional unbudgeted consultation time for the Municipal Plan and Zoning By-law up to a maximum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) as recommended by the Clerk/Development Officer.

#### 14.4 Paving Tender

#### 14.5 <u>Arena Refrigeration</u>
