2. REGULAR SESSION – PUBLIC COUNCIL MEETING

Mayor Chorley called the Open Session to order at 7:10 p.m. He noted that Councillor Clara Lights was on vacation.

3. MOMENT OF SILENCE AND MOMENT OF REFLECTION

Mayor Chorley led Council in a moment of reflection.

5. PRESENTATIONS AND DELEGATIONS

5.1 CPL. PAT COLE, RCMP

Cpl. Cole reported that there was nothing out of the ordinary this month. They completed a roadside check of sixty cars which resulted in one liquor violation on one *Motor Vehicle Act* fine. He noted that they continue to make regular checks of their prolific offenders. The results resulted in several probation violations and the offenders were sent back to jail. He stated that they had received several noise complaints from the Vintage Bistro and the Hampton Courthouse Club. The officers will be monitoring the situation.

5.2 Bill Merrifield, Stonehammer Geopark

Mr. Merrifield updated Council on the Stonehammer Geopark application. The Town of Hampton had entered into the Memorandum of Understanding to be included as a site in this park. He advised Council that Stonehammer Geopark is about more than just the rocks. Stonehammer is about history, culture and recreation activities that highlight geology.

He stated that the name Stonehammer was selected to pay homage to the *Steinhammer Club* who were a group of Saint John geologists who made important geological discoveries from 1857-1862. The Stonehammer Geopark is located within 2500 square kilometers of southern New Brunswick and includes the Hampton Lighthouse River Centre. This region has a complex geological history.

He noted to Council that seven members of the Stonehammer Geopark team attended the 4th International UNESCO Conference on Geoparks. From this, they were granted a site evaluation, which is the final stage of the application process. The evaluation will take place from August 30th until September 2nd and will be conducted by Dr. Patrick McKeever and Claudia Eckhardt of the Global Geoparks Network and by Dr. Godfrey Nowlan of the Canadian National Committee for Geoparks. The site visit will include a helicopter tour of the proposed Stonehammer Geopark, visits to the publicly accessible Stonehammer sites, activities with direct operators, interaction with community stakeholders, multicultural events and cultural history gastronomic experiences.

The site evaluators will meet in Greece in October and the committee hopes that there will be a positive announcement shortly after the conference.
