Five Year Designated Highway Plan

Moved by Councillor Doucet and seconded by Councillor Behr that the Town of Hampton approve the *FIVE YEAR DESIGNATED HIGHWAY PLAN*, as recommended by the Public Works Superintendent, as outlined below:

- 2011 Route 845 Pickwauket Road Pad and chip-seal. The Town of Hampton will cut off the knoll at the intersection of Norton Shore Road and Pickwauket Road and widen the shoulder to create a safer area to walk.
- 2012 Route 121 Main Street Milling and paving from 808 Main Street (Community Centre) to the Kennebecasis River Road.
- 2013 Route 121 Main Street Milling and paving from the intersection of the Hall Road to 808 Main Street.
- 2014 Route 121 Main Street Milling and paving from the Kennebecasis River Road one kilometer eastbound.
- 2015 Route 121 Main Street Milling and paving. Pickup from 2014 and one kilometer eastbound.
