2. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Doucet called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm.

3. SILENT MOMENT OF REFLECTION

Mayor Doucet requested that everyone take a moment of silent reflection.

6. DELEGATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARING

6.1 <u>Hampton RCMP</u>

Sgt. Tyson Nelson provided Council with an update on activity for October. There were 105 files opened in the Hampton area. This was down from last month but there were less self-generated files as there were high-risk and serious files this month. There were 7 check stops in October. There were 79 tickets issued and 38 Warnings. This included two for exhaust infractions and 2 for cellphones use when operating a vehicle. The RCMP provided education on internet safety at the high school to a group of students after a fraud invent. Sgt. Nelson provided an update on the robbery at the Irving. They received mutual aid from Grand Bay to Riverview, with 13 officers on the scene.

6.2 Darrell Ruttle, Lighthouse River Centre Boat launch

Darrell Ruttle said that for the last few years he has had to take his boat out at Meenan's Cove instead of Hampton because of the condition of the Lighthouse River Centre Boat launch. The gravel/fill is missing between the slabs and the sides were about an 8-inch drop. He raked some in himself. He is recommending the addition of three additional slabs deeper into the water as well as maintenance of the fill. He also wondered about dredging there. He referred to Ducks Unlimited using a "cookie cutter" to dredge Beamer's Creek through to Darlings Island.

Council referred the matter to the Director of Facilities.

No communities have experiencing problems. Dillon Consulting is working on proposal regarding the Recreation Master Plan. The Programs and Events Coordinator is working on a draft schedule and budget for Canada Day and working on the Winter Wonderland on December 3rd. There is a new user-friendly program in the lobby TV. Leisure Services Staff have the lights up on Spooner's Island, the Legion Banners are hung. Leadership training continues for the Director of Leisure Services and Pool Supervisor.
