# HAMPTON'S HISTORY



**H**ampton has a rich history dating back to the Loyalists arrival in 1784.

During this time, the community thrived on its agricultural industry, but the railway, mills, and a steamship business contributed to its growth in the 19th century.

Due to the success of the area, Hampton gained its designation of Shiretown, which led to the opening of the Kings County Courthouse (now serving as our Town Hall). The first session was held in May 1872. Another feature of our historic past that is well-preserved in our


our square is the Kings County Gaol (Jail). It was moved from Kingston, New Brunswick over ice, brick by brick, to be reconstructed in Hampton in the 1870's. Tours of the "old jail" can be taken through the Kings County Museum, right behind Town Hall.



Hampton was also the site of the first recorded telephone in the province, which was leased to the G&G Flewelling Manufacturing Co.

Finally, our small town is famously known for being the birthplace of John Peters Humphrey, the author of the first draft of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1947. You can observe many public art installations across town in his honour on our Public Art Tour.

## See our Covered Bridges

In 1953, New Brunswick was home to 340 covered bridges—today, only 58 remain. These charming wooden structures are treasured pieces of our history, standing as iconic symbols of our region's heritage. The Hampton area is fortunate to have 3 of these landmarks that have been preserved, each offering a glimpse into the past and a connection to our province's rich cultural story.

## HISTORIC COVERED BRIDGES

### DAMASCUS COVERED BRIDGE

Built in 1914, the Smithtown Covered Bridge spans 56 meters (183 feet) over the Hammond River, blending history with natural beauty. A peaceful stop along a scenic drive, this well-preserved landmark reflects the region's rich heritage. To find it, take Route 1, Exit 158, follow Route 100 west for 2.7 km (1.6 mi.), continue on Lakeside Road for 4.7 km (2.9 mi.), then take Route 860 east for 1 km (0.6 mi.) before turning onto Damascus Road.

### DARLINGS ISLAND COVERED BRIDGE

Built in 1914, this bridge is celebrating 111 years on the Hammond River! While it is no longer in service for vehicles, it offers a popular stop for tourists, historians and sightseers alike. Every Christmas, neighbours hang thousands of lights to decorate this historic gem. Open year-round. Parking available at south end of bridge.

### BLOOMFIELD COVERED BRIDGE

Built in 1917, the Bloomfield Covered Bridge spans 45 meters (146 feet) and remains a charming piece of New Brunswick's history. Nestled in a picturesque rural setting, this timeless wooden bridge offers a glimpse into the past while providing a scenic spot for visitors to admire. Easily accessible, take Route 1, Exit 166, then follow Bloomfield Ridge South Road northwest, turn right onto Centennial Road, and left onto Bloomfield Station Road.
