Committees of Council



Hampton's Council operates four main types of committees: Executive, Standing, Ad Hoc, and Subcommittees. These committees handle municipal priorities, aid policy development, and organize Hampton's special events. Many of these committees rely on volunteer members.

Those interested in volunteering on committees can contact Town Hall at 506-832-6065, email info@hampton.ca, or visit www.hampton.ca to apply. Standing Committees have a three-year term, and usually meet monthly, while other committees may have shorter terms for specific tasks or events.

STANDING COMMITTEES

ENVIRONMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Advises Council on long-term strategies, planning and policy development for environmental issues in the community and assists with the Partners in Climate Protection program.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & TOURISM ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Dedicated to the attraction, development, retention, and expansion of business in Hampton and addressing opportunities surrounding tourism in the community.

PARKS & RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Advises Council on long-term strategic planning & policy development for the Parks & Recreation Departments. The committee oversees such things as parks, playgrounds, public courts, pool, trails, Summit Centre, Mike Murphy Memorial Field House.

PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) is tasked with fulfilling responsibilities outlined in the Community Planning Act and directives from Hampton Council. Its members include representatives from various Council committees: Public Works & Utilities Advisory, Parks & Recreation Advisory, Economic Development and Tourism Advisory, and Environment Advisory. The PAC advises the Town Council on land use planning and serves as the authority for approving variances.

PUBLIC WORKS & UTILITIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Advises Council on long-term strategic planning and policy development for the Public Works & Utilities Department. The committee oversees such things as the sanitary sewer and public water system, streets, storm water management, winter maintenance and solid waste collection in the Town and makes recommendations to Council regarding infrastructure.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEES

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Reviews the financial position of the Town on a regular basis. Working closely with department heads, the committee prepares the annual budget, monitors the expenditures, oversees the yearly audit, and develops long-range financial objectives.

HEALTH CARE COMMITTEE

Advises Council on matters related to the enhancement of the provision of primary care services and other health care matters. Serves as liaison between Hampton & health service providers. Physician recruitment is a top priority.

HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE

Makes recommendations related to employee recruitment, retention, training, compensation management and labour relations.

JOINT HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE

An important communications link between town employees and management and helps create and maintain a positive health & safety culture in our workplace.

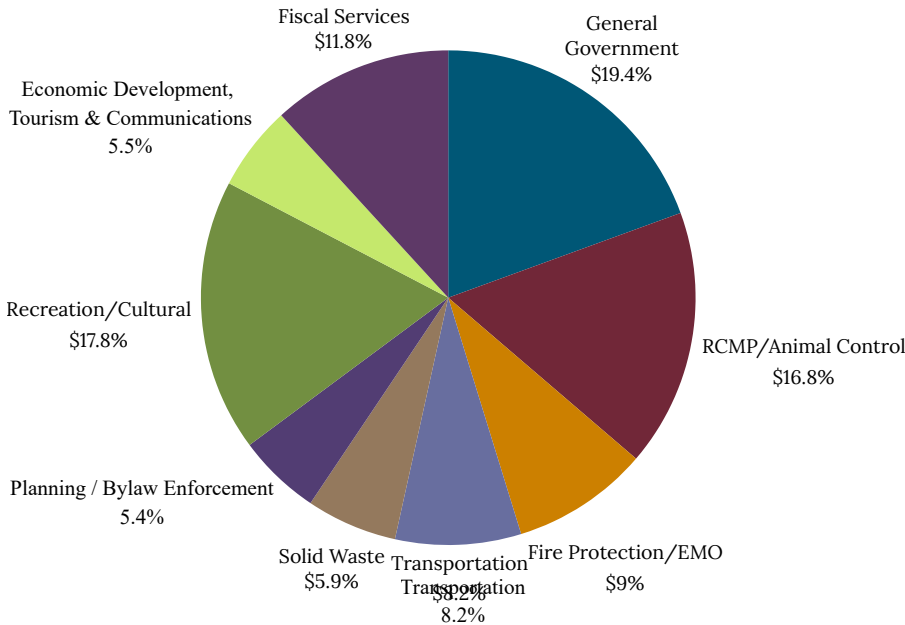

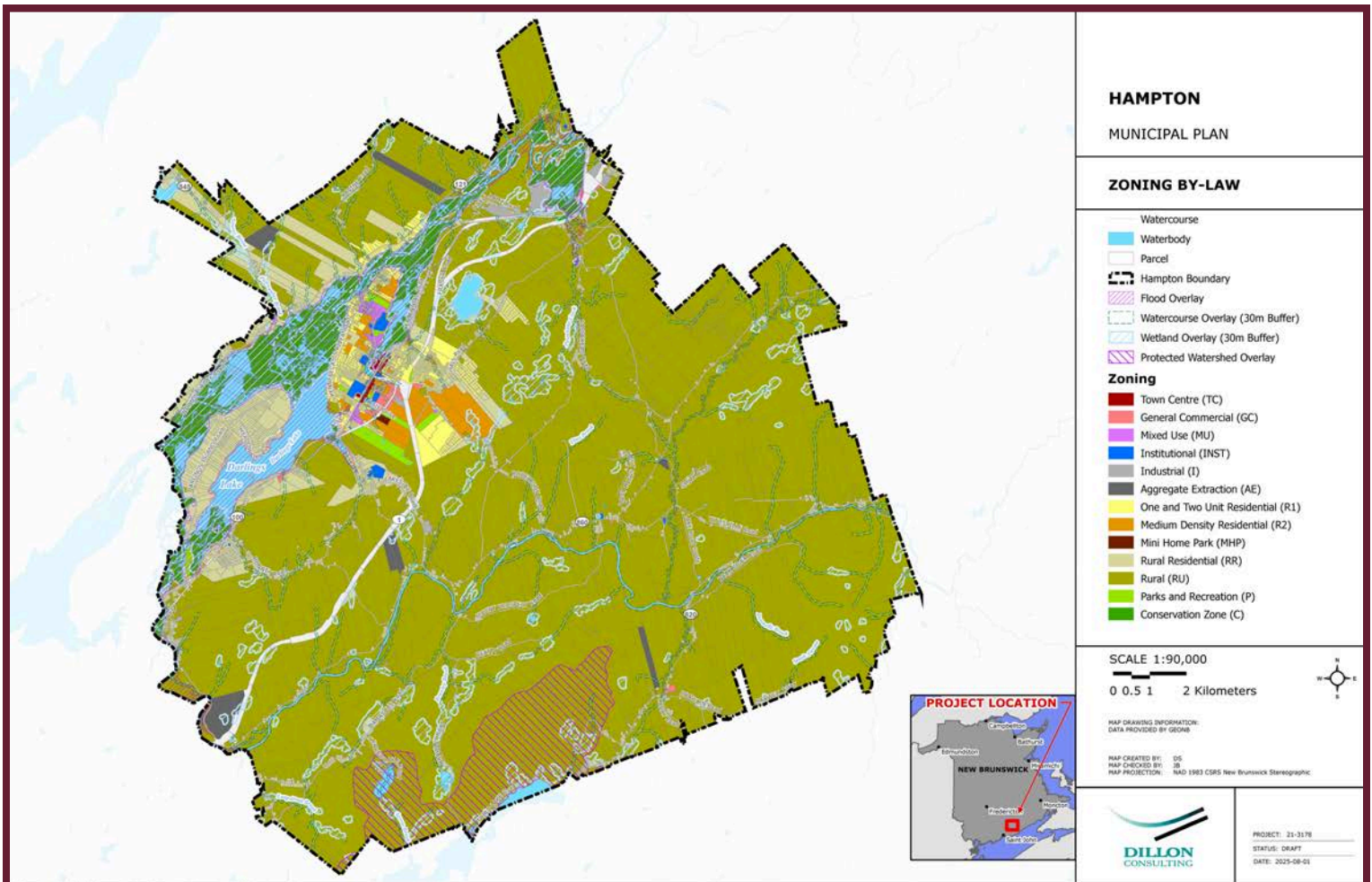


MUNICIPAL PLAN

On January 1st, 2023, the newly restructured municipality of Hampton came into legal effect, bringing a renewed vision for the future, built upon a rich history of community stewardship. To guide land use decisions for the community, a new Municipal Plan was prepared in accordance with Sections 24 to 27 of the New Brunswick Community Planning Act, SNB 2017, c. 19. The Municipal Plan is the principal guiding policy document for Hampton. It is the result of extensive public engagement, best practice review, and contextual analysis, enabling Council and Staff to make sound decisions affecting development and growth for the next 10 years. The full document is available on our website at hampton.ca.

ZONING BY-LAW

The Zoning By-law actions policies that are laid out in the Municipal Plan and prescribe the standards for which land, buildings and structures may be used. The Zoning By-law was enacted on January 9th, 2024, to guide development in Hampton. As a living document, the by-law has undergone various amendments to best suit land use patterns. 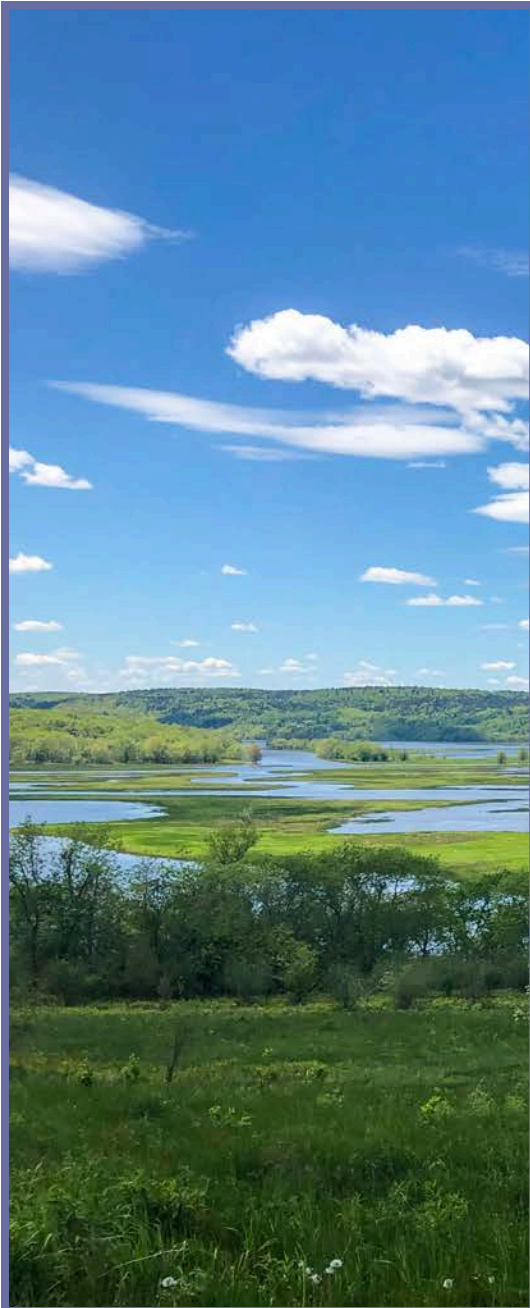

Natural Environment & Climate Protection



The protection of the natural environment and environmentally sensitive areas is necessary to ensure their continued availability to the public and future generations. Through careful design and protection of these areas, we can help ensure a healthy functioning ecosystem in the wetlands, rivers, waterways and escarpments that define Hampton.

Policies concerning water resources, stormwater management, flooding, tree preservation, climate change adaptation, and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions are developed and supported through studies and programs conducted within our community. This work today ensures environmental protection and climate change adaptation solutions for generations to come.



PARTNERS FOR CLIMATE PROTECTION

Since 2004, the town has participated in the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' (FCM) Partners for Climate Protection (PCP) program. The PCP program consists of a five-milestone approach that begins by developing a greenhouse gas emissions inventory for the municipality and setting emissions reduction and energy efficiency targets. Hampton completed the fifth and final milestone of this program in 2023.

CLIMATE ADAPTATION PLAN

Hampton recently completed a community engagement and feasibility study, "Assessing Flood Adaptation Solution in Hampton". This study supported the town's application to the Local Leadership for Climate Adaptation initiative managed by the Green Municipal Fund. This project works to address flooding impacts to community and transportation assets as identified in Hampton's Climate Change Adaptation Plan.

ENVIRONMENTAL PARTNERS

Hampton enjoys ongoing support for environmental education and programming initiatives from several key partners:

Hampton Nature Club (Mayor's Monarch Pledge, Main Street Rain Garden, Chimney Swift habitat at Town Hall in conjunction with Birds Canada Swift Watch)

Kennebecasis Watershed Restoration Committee (invasive species monitoring, tree seed collection in Dutch Point Park, Pollinator Garden, Clean Drain Dry watercraft program, Passekeag Creek restoration project)

NatureNB (Dutch Point Park Audio Tour, youth naturalist programming)

STOREFRONT IMPROVEMENT GRANT

Hampton and the Community Business Development Corporation (CBDC Charlotte-Kings) partner to support commercial building revitalization initiatives by offering incentives for the renovation of eligible business storefronts in the municipality of Hampton.

The Storefront Improvement Assistance Program is designed to encourage retail and commercial building owners to invest in storefront renovations and upgrades by providing a grant of 50% of upgrade costs (to a max of \$5000). There is also an optional loan available through CBDC to assist with renovation costs.

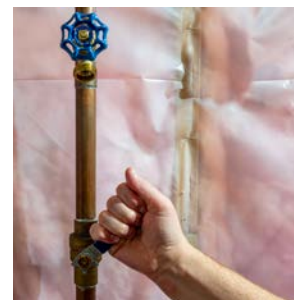

Collection Schedule

Garbage is collected on a bi-weekly schedule on your designated collection day.

- One week will be designated for garbage collection, followed by compost collection the next week.
- **Residents must ensure the correct cart is placed at the curb by 7:00AM on their collection day.**

Garbage Collection Guidelines

- Garbage collection is limited to the capacity of the Hampton-issued garbage cart; extra bags will not be collected.
- Only Hampton-issued carts will be collected, and garbage must be properly bagged inside the cart.
- Garbage carts must weigh less than 50 kg (100 lbs).
- Carts should be placed curbside with the wheels and handles facing the road, preferably on the right-hand side.
- Ensure any lid straps are unfastened before collection - leaving them on may result in non-collection or damaged straps.

Collection Schedule

Compost is collected on a bi-weekly schedule on your designated collection day.

- One week will be designated for compost collection, followed by garbage collection the next week.
- **Residents must ensure the correct cart is placed at the curb by 7:00AM on their collection day.**

Compost Collection Guidelines

- Compost collection is provided using carts supplied and maintained by Fundy Regional Service Commission.
- Compostable materials may be placed directly in the cart or in certified compostable bags, which are recommended to help keep carts clean and prevent freezing during winter months.
- There is no volume limit for compost. If materials exceed the cart's capacity, residents may place additional compostable bags beside the cart on collection day.
- Pet waste must be placed in compostable bags or wrapped in newspaper.
- Small twigs should be placed inside the compost cart. Larger branches less than two inches in diameter, and up to four feet in length, must be bundled and tied, then placed beside the cart.
- Additional leaves must be placed in brown paper bags for collection.
- Ensure any lid straps are unfastened before collection - leaving them on may result in non-collection or damaged straps.

Residential Compost Collection



Recycling Collection



Recycling is collected **biweekly** on your designated scheduled recycling day.

- In **Wards 1 & 2**, recycling occurs during garbage collection weeks.
- In **Ward 3**, recycling occurs during compost collection weeks.

Each household will receive two recycling bins:

- **Blue Bin:** Paper & Cardboard materials
- **Green Bin:** Plastic Containers, Metal Containers & Cartons

Recycling services are administered by **Circular Materials**, a not-for-profit organization responsible for managing New Brunswick's transition to the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) program. Collection is carried out by Fero, contracted through Circular Materials.

Large Item Pick Up



Large Item Pickup – Wards 1, 2 & 3

On your regular garbage collection day, residents in all Hampton wards may place one large item at the curb for collection.

Important Guidelines

- Only **one single item** is permitted per collection day.
- An extra bag of garbage does **NOT** qualify as a large item.
- Items made up of multiple separate pieces will not be collected.

Refrigeration and Cooling Units

Refrigeration units are accepted for collection, including fridges, freezers, air conditioners, heat pumps, and pool heaters, provided the following requirements are met:

- Freon must be removed by a licensed technician.
- The unit must display a sticker confirming certified Freon removal.
- Doors must be removed or securely fastened to prevent safety hazards.

Items Not Accepted

The following items are not accepted for large item pickup:

- Hazardous materials, including propane tanks, drywall, and automotive parts
- Tires (these may be returned to the retailer where they were purchased)

- **Immediate Zone**
- **Intermediate Zone**
- **Extended Zone**

By addressing risks in each area, starting closest to the home and working outward, homeowners can reduce opportunities for embers to accumulate and limit the spread of flames.
